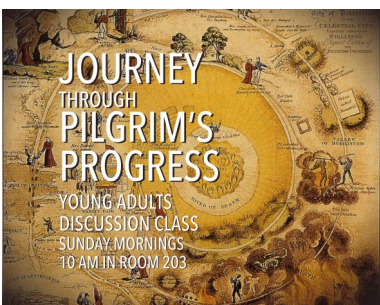

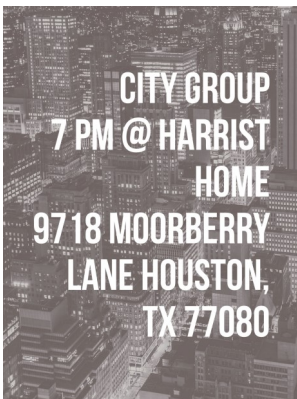
I hope you are having a great Tuesday. Below you will find all the information about upcoming events at CEPC for Young Adults.
