Westminster Shorter Catechism Q/A 76-78: **Call to Confession** Adapted from Heidelberg Catechism Q/A 112; Exodus 20:16 Minister: What is the ninth commandment? People: The ninth commandment is: You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor. Minister: What does the ninth commandment require? People: The ninth commandment requires us to tell the truth and to maintain and promote it and our own and others' reputations, especially when testifying. Minister: What does the ninth commandment forbid? People: The ninth commandment forbids anything that gets in the way of the truth or injures

- anyone's reputation.
- Minister: What is God's will for you in the ninth commandment?
- People: God's will is that I never give false testimony against anyone, twist no one's words, not gossip or slander, nor join in condemning anyone without a hearing or without a just cause. Rather, in court and everywhere else, I should avoid lying and deceit of every kind. I should love the truth, speak it candidly, and openly acknowledge it. And I should do what I can to guard and advance my neighbor's good name.
